Auditions for STAGED READINGS will take place in five-minute increments and will involve a cold reading from the play. Cold readings may be done individually or in groups, depending on the director's discretion. Auditions are conducted on a first-come, first-served basis. Audition forms will be available at the time of the audition and must be filled out and turned in to the Theatre Department Chair.
