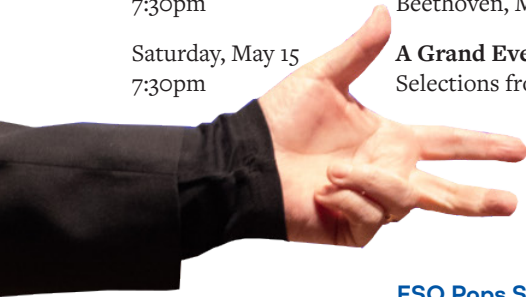

As the season continues, we lean into bold contrasts. *Witch* by Jen Silverman brings a contemporary bite and deliciously dark sense of humor to the Elgood in April. And, for the first time, the second week of performances for one of our productions will overlap with our annual *New Works Festival*, inviting audiences to experience staged readings of brand new plays and musicals right alongside one of our mainstage productions.

We're also swimming into new territory this season with *Finn*, a vibrant, family-friendly musical adventure. This brand new musical invites us into a bold, imaginative world filled with heart, humor, and spectacle. It's an exciting opportunity to welcome new audiences into the theatre while continuing our commitment to championing new work.

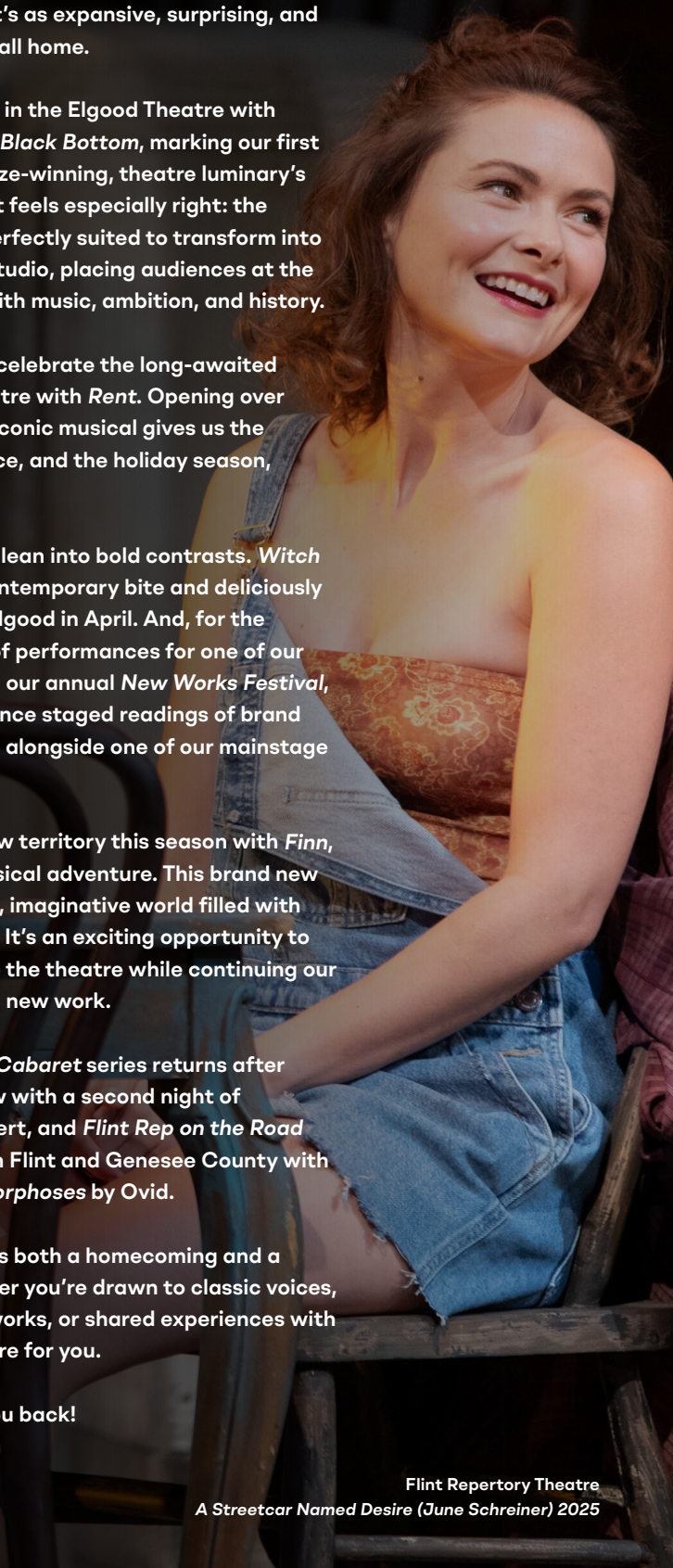

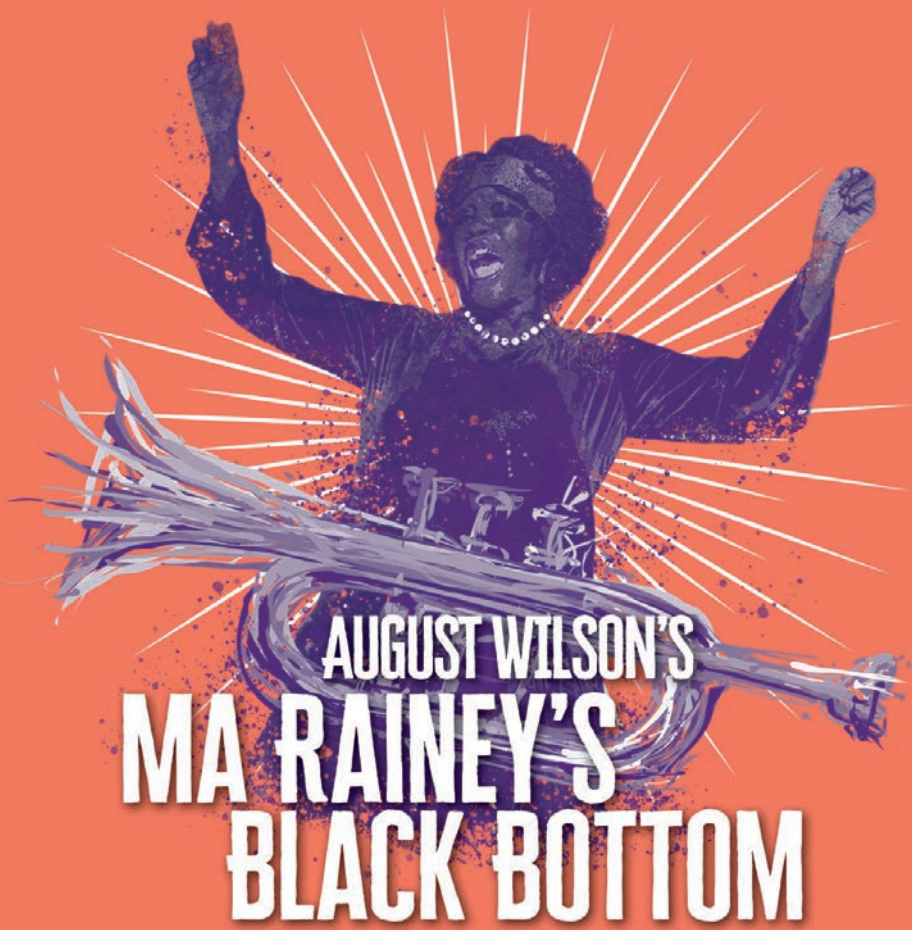

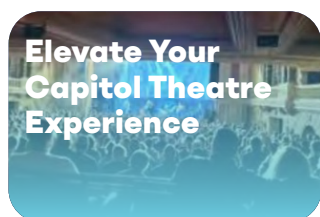

Since launching a major label career in 1994, Collective Soul has charted a path that most rock bands dream of, but only few achieve. They cut through a noisy 1990s rock scene with a knack for stick-to-you-like-glue melodies, roof-shaking guitars, and a touch of Southern grit. Behind enduring singles like “Shine,” “December” and “The World I Know,” the band hit the ground running for what would not be a short-lived sprint, but a steady marathon of uncompromising – and always catchy – albums. 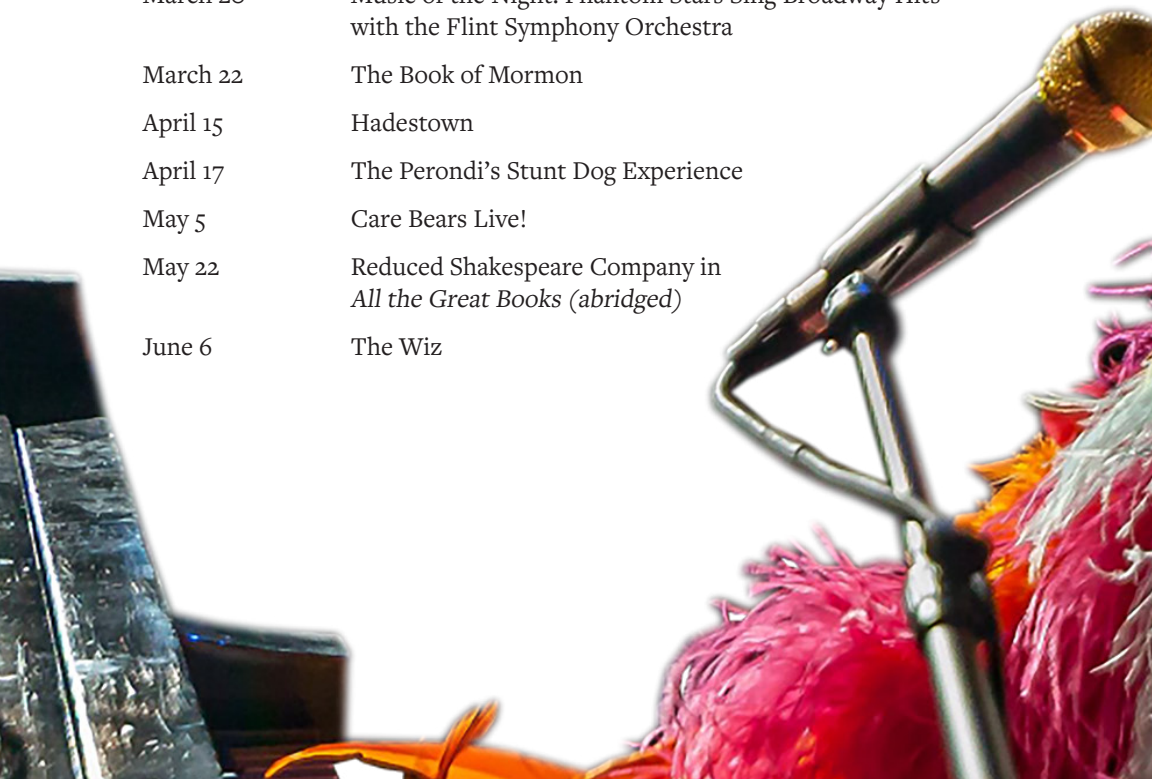

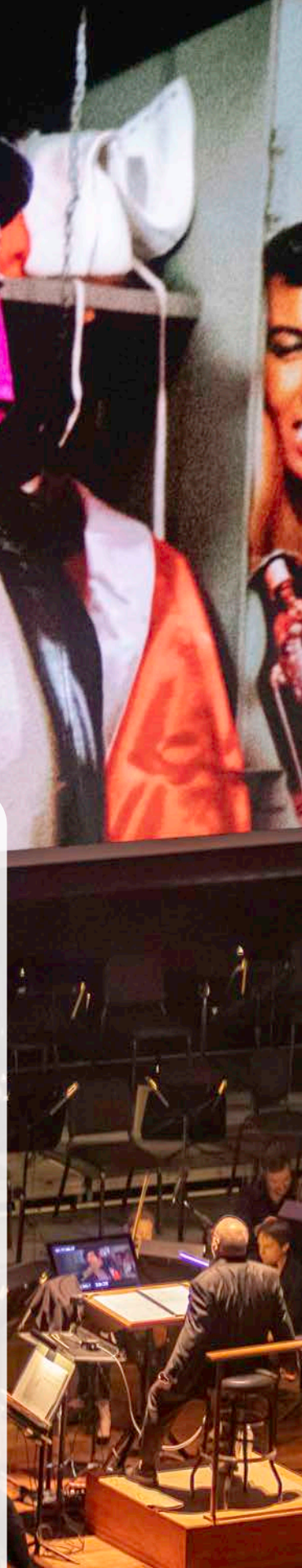

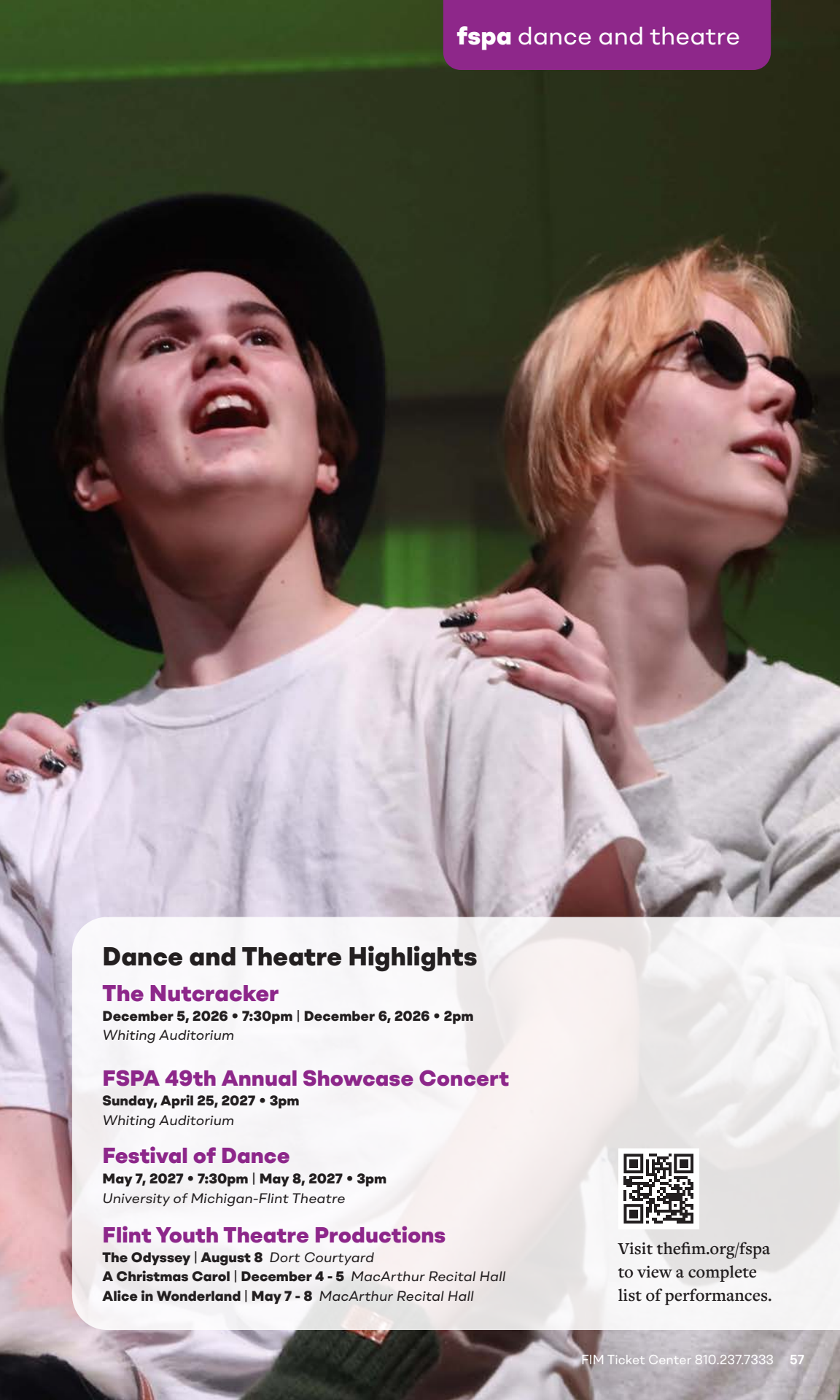
